### **Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities**

Community approved APP'S are

- (1) Substance Abuse
- (2) Domestic Violence
- (3) Youth - Substance Abuse

- (1) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Substance abuse by conducting dedicated community patrols. Wha Ti members continue to receive information on how alcohol and drugs are being brought into the community. Patrols are made for the purpose of intercepting alcohol and drugs on land, air and water. There have been multiple seizures of liquor and drugs so far this year. Twenty two mickeys destined for Wha Ti were seized at Air Tindi by the Yellowknife RCMP. Also eight mickeys were seized at the Wha Ti airport by RCMP in relation to an anonymous tip.

The community has held some community events and dances for the local residence to give an alternative to drugs or alcohol.

- (2) There was one reported domestic assaults in July 2014. The Wha Ti Detachment has information booklets on Spousal and Partner Abuse. Also the Detachment has booklets on Dating Violence. This information is provided to those who need or want it.

The community has counselors who come into to the community and assist with relationship counseling to those who seek it.

- (3) This month the detachment was involved with the youth by speaking with them at the youth center, on the playgrounds and around the community when patrolling. The youth of this community frequently attend the Wha Ti detachment for stickers and coloring books, this opportunity is used to educate the youth on the abuse of alcohol and drugs. New books focusing on youth and drugs have been distributed during July with discussions had with the youth on the content. Members attend to the Youth Center and interact with the youth here as well.

The community is actively trying to hire a youth coordinator to aid in planning events for the young people in this community. Currently the community does not have anything in place for organized sports or youth events.

### **Notable events for Month:**

This month was the annual Tlicho Assembly held in Wha Ti. The population was expected to double and the detachment was prepared. The Wha Ti detachment had a three Member compliment during this event. Members reported that calls were to a minimum during the first 5 days. Once the detachment compliment went back to two Members the call volume increased considerably.

### **Notable Occurrences for the Month:**

There were three reported break and enters during the month of July. One has been solved with charges laid. One other was unsolved and another is currently under investigation.

### **New Community Concerns (update on concerns raised in the past not yet resolved)**

Members continued to address the concerns that a new gang appeared to be forming involving young youth males. This issue is being addressed by the entire community including the Wha Ti RCMP Detachment. Members had a couple meetings with Chief and Counsel over the past two months to express their concerns. An ongoing effort is continuing to get the community involved in putting an end to this.

### **Community Policing Activities or Events (if not identified in the APP's)**

- Members attended a local hand games event
- Members had a traditional meal with the community
- Members made an appearance during a bingo game
- Members attended the local youth center and spoke with the kids
- Members conducted a boat patrol

Members at the Wha Ti RCMP Detachment have stressed to the community that they need more involvement with activities for the youth. So far most of these activities are being carried out by the School teachers and RCMP Members will little to no help from the community residents.
