Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

Community approved APP'S are

(1) Substance Abuse(2) Domestic Violence(3) Youth - Substance Abuse

(1) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Substance abuse by conducting dedicated community patrols. Wha Ti members continue to receive information on how alcohol and drugs are being brought into the community. Patrols are made for the purpose of intercepting alcohol and drugs on land, air and water. There have been multiple seizures of liquor and drugs so far this year. A total of 52 375ml bottles of hard alcohol, 7 beer, 1 partial bottle of rum, and 1 bucket of homebrew was seized in the community of Wha Ti by the local RCMP Members. Three people have been charged in relation to the Wha Ti Liquor Prohibition Regulation in the Month of August.

The community has held some community events and dances for the local residents to give an alternative to drugs or alcohol.

(2) There was one reported domestic assault in August 2014. The accused was arrested and held in custody for a show cause hearing in Yellowknife on 2014-09-02. The Wha Ti Detachment has information booklets on Spousal and Partner Abuse. Also the Detachment has booklets on Dating Violence. This information is provided to those who need or want it.

The community has counselors who come into the community and assist with relationship counseling to those who seek it. Wha Ti has a potential full time Social Worker coming in for a full time position.

(3) This month the detachment was involved with the youth by speaking with them at the youth center, on the playgrounds and around the community when patrolling. The youth of this community frequently attend the Wha Ti detachment for stickers and coloring books, this opportunity is used to educate the youth on the abuse of alcohol and drugs. New books focusing on youth and drugs have been distributed during August and discussions had with the youth on the content. Members attend to the Youth Center and interact with the youth here as well.

The community is actively trying to hire a youth coordinator to aid in planning events for the young people in this community. Currently the community does not have anything in place for organized sports or youth events.

Notable events for Month:

Notable Occurrences for the Month:

During the month of August 2014 Members seized 52 375ml bottles of alcohol, 1 partial 40oz bottle of rum, and 1 bucket of home brew. Three Liquor tickets have been issued in relation to the Wha Ti Liquor Prohibition Regulations.

New Community Concerns (update on concerns raised in the past not yet resolved)

Members continued to address the concerns that a new gang appeared to be forming involving young youth males. This issue is being addressed by the entire community including the Wha Ti RCMP Detachment. Members had a couple meetings with Chief and Counsel over the past two months to express their concerns. An ongoing effort is continuing to get the community involved in putting an end to this.

Community Policing Activities or Events (if not identified in the APP's)

- Members attended a traditional meal with the community.

- Members continually attended the airport to assist the local store and community members unload the planes and help them with their luggage.

- Members attended the local youth center and spoke with the kids.
- Cpl. LOGAN attended the local hand games and participated.

Members at the Wha Ti RCMP Detachment have stressed to the community that they need more involvement with activities for the youth. So far most of these activities are being carried out by the School teachers and RCMP Members with little to no help from the community residents.
