a. Need for Council Lobbying for All-Season Road

Chief Alfonz Nitsiza provided a report to Council on his trip to Ottawa where the Tłįcho Chief Executive Council met to seek new funding for road development in the Tłįcho Region, which would include other resource and economic developments. He discussed the need for building partnerships and working with other agencies to achieve these goals.

Moosenose, that Council direct Administration to draft letters, for the Chief's signature, to the Premier and Federal & Territorial Ministers requesting support for development of an All-Season Road as well as local economic development initiatives (such as a hotel and café), and mining training programs.

a. Motion Required for Land Lease - John Beaverho & Celine Beaverho

Moved by Councillor Alex Nitsiza, Seconded by Councillor George Nitsiza, that Council approve the Land Application by **John Beaverho & Celine Beaverho** for Lot 165, Plan 3922, and that Administration for the Community Government of Whatì be authorized to draft and execute a land lease for the noted parcel.

b. Adjust Council Meeting Dates for March 2015

Moved by Councillor George Nitsiza, Seconded by Councillor Leo Nitsiza, that Council postpone the March 16, 2015 Council Meeting to March 30, 2015. Further, that Administration be directed to post this change for public notice.

c. Caribou Issue Update

Chief Alfonz Nitsiza discussed the coming restriction on caribou hunting in the NWT, and the difficulty of maintaining a 'mobile zone'. 2,800 tags have been approved for harvesting (blue-nose) which will have a significant impact on the Tłįcho residents. Another inventory of caribou stocks will be completed in June 2015. Chief Alfonz Nitsiza talked about the difficulty of controlling and enforcement of these changes.

d. Winter Road Quality Concerns

Councillor Leo Nitsiza suggested that Administration draft a letter for the Chiefs signature to the Department of Transportation suggesting that the Community Government provide road services from the lagoon junction to the Gametì Junction. Council is deeply concerned that the current quality of road construction will break-up sooner this winter and not provide enough use to meet transportation and supply requirements.

e. Dene Nation Health Conference

Councillor Michel Moosenose provided a brief report to Council, including some of the concerns about aboriginal patients having a lack of support ... such as translation services while they are sent out to treatment or health centres (Edmonton, etc.)

f. Arctic Energy Alliance - Solar Panels

Councillor Sonny Zoe discussed the concept of installing a solar array along the runway which would replace the diesel-powered electrical generation in Whati. Administration will be working with him more on researching this option.

g. TCSA Representative - Report to Council

Councillor Ted Nitsiza discussed some TCSA concerns about patient transfers where children (or mentally-immature) patients are accompanied with an escort where only the patient is transferred without the escort. Better communication is also required between the local clinics and the specialists.

Chief Alfonz Nitsiza asked if Council or Administration had any final thoughts or concerns that they wanted to discuss.

Councillor Sonny Zoe asked why there isn't a Renewable Resources Officer in Whatì. Chief Alfonz Nitsiza discussed the topic and suggested that this was something that needs to be re-addressed.

Councillor Alex Nitsiza reminded Council about the importance of supporting the local Inter-Agency Organization and the various agencies that attend.

Administration advised Council about some topics discussed at the DRAFT All-Season Road Impact Study review, and one of the topics discussed was the possibility of re-activating the *Nechi* addictions counseling program to be delivered in Whatì.

Dear Premier McLeod:

RE: All-Season Road from Highway 3 to Whati

On behalf of the Community Government of Whati, I want to voice an important concern to the Territorial Government regarding the All-Season Road to Whati.

While an all-season road to Whati has been discussed for decades, back into the 1960s as far as I can remember, the topic has been of much higher profile these last few years. The reason for this increased discussion, of course, is due to the resource development potential that is now available.

Whereas the oil and gas industry appears to be taking an extended down-turn, development of other natural resources would benefit everyone. For example, the royalty revenues that the Federal and Territorial Government may, on one hand, be losing from oil and gas, may very well be supplanted by increased attention to mineral resource development. To make that revenue stream a reality, however, there is a need for all-season road development in the Tłįcho region: Specifically the link between Highway 3 and Whatì.

True, the All-Season Road will create an access to one Tłįchǫ community, however the reality is that it would provide a benefit to more than Whatì. All four Tłįchǫ communities, the Northwest Territories, and all of Canada would realize benefit. This is one of those rare *Win-Win-Win-Win* situations. With each phase of development ... whether road construction, mine development, mining activity, and product transportation ... everyone will benefit from the increased employment and business activity.

It is also important to remember that the resource development in the Tłįchǫ region will not create benefit for mere decades but, more correctly, a century or more. This infrastructure investment will create both a lasting legacy as well as a long-term revenue stream. Finally, not only mineral access made possible, but clean hydro-electric generation becomes economically feasible.

When interest rates at all-time lows, when contractors are increasingly available as the oil and gas industries slow, and when mining companies are eager to find new ventures, Council of the Community Government of Whati sincerely hopes that the Premier's Office will consider the many benefits of an All-Season Road from Highway 3 to the Whati Junction.

Council of the Community Government of Whatì looks forward to discussing this initiative with you in more detail in the near future.

RE: Hotel and Restaurant for Whati

Council for the Community Government of Whatì wants to ensure that the Chief Executive Council appreciates how important that the proposed Hotel and Restaurant for Whatì is perceived in our community. Unlike the other three Tłįcho communities, Whatì does NOT have a hotel or restaurant.

As any member of Chief Executive Council or the Tłįchǫ Government staff will understand from any over-night visits to Whatì, 'accommodation' is both rudimentary and expensive. Visitors must stay in a room of one of the mobile homes owned by the Lac La Martre Development Corporation (LLMDC) and fend for themselves when it comes to meals. Visitors can purchase pre-packaged microwavable sandwiches at the Community Store, or maybe a frozen dinner, or bring their own food in with them.

Unlike some other Tłįcho communities, who may be waiting for a new local presence building, at least they currently have a local presence building for residents to meet with the Chief and staff. Whatì has NO hotel and NO restaurant.

Council for the Community Government of Whati is extremely pleased that, after a decade waiting for a new Tłįchǫ Government to take action to assist our community, it appears that this basic community service may soon become a reality. We extend our thanks and will to do all we can to assist the Tłįchǫ Government in making this a reality.
