The second foster parent sharing group was held March 19, 2018 with 8 people in attendance. The group discussed how to build extended family connections with children in care, upcoming training, and planned a cook out for our next event.



The Department of Health and Social Services has adjusted and increased foster care rates as follows:

In an interview with CBC North (April 4, 2018), Tammy Krivda, Executive Director of the Foster Family Coalition, applauded the decision and stated that foster parents will be better able to care for children in their care and won't have to spend money out of pocket.

The new foster rates will be applied to the next foster



care cheques, issued May 10, 2018.

Adoption Subsidy Change

Subsidized adoption rates will increase from 60% to 90% of the basic maintenance rates for approved adoptive parents. This change will help families who want to adopt but were unable to due to financial strain.

Fostering Questions and Answers

Can I bring my foster child with me out of the country?

Yes! We encourage our foster parents to travel with their foster children as this amazing opportunity expands their worldview and helps children feel every much a part of the family as biological children who may be travelling. It is important to let the social worker know of your plans early, so the worker can get everything prepared for the passport application. There is also travel allowance that you can request to assist with the foster child's experience. A travel letter will be prepared by the social worker as well.

What do I do if my foster child has an appointment in Yellowknife?

You are encouraged to take your foster children to all of their appointments, as you are responsible for their day to day care. After the appointment, updating the social worker about any mediation or further testing is important for our records.

Are there any summer camps for foster children?

There are many summer camp opportunities for foster children, and the cost of camp can be covered by BCFS. All of our children are invited to participate in CAMP CONNECTIONS. There are also overnight camps organized by various church groups, community agencies and nonprofit societies. Talk to you social worker for more details.
