IMPACT SUMMER CAMP FOR INDIGENOUS GIRLS

In partnership with the University of Waterloo, De Beers Canada Inc. is offering an opportunity for 10 Indigenous students to participate in IMPACT Girls Summer Camp program in Waterloo, Ontario. De Beers Canada will fund participation at the camp for selected participants.

Scope

The IMPACT Girls Summer Camp is a two-day, post-secondary education awareness camp for Grade 7-8 Indigenous girls and their caregivers hosted at St. Paul's University College in Waterloo, Ontario. The campers will learn, guided by knowledge keepers, through a series of hands-on workshops in which they apply cultural teachings to Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) fields, and learn about post-secondary options. Parents and caregivers will be given tools to encourage their child to pursue an interest in STEM learning.

The Camp is generously sponsored by the HeForShe initiative, De Beers Canada, Inc. and the IMPACT 10X10X10 framework for gender equity at the University of Waterloo.

Goal

The goal of the IMPACT Girls Summer Camp is to promote post-secondary education awareness and build confidence in girls to consider a career in the STEM fields. By building awareness of post-secondary options while incorporating cultural teachings and practices, camp participants develop the confidence to pursue greater goals while being encouraged and supported by their caregivers in a fun environment!

Details

The Camp takes place August 14-15, 2019, with sign-in beginning in the evening on August 13th at St. Paul's University College at the University of Waterloo. Campers and caregivers will stay in the residence at St. Paul's and all meals are provided for the duration of the camp. Applications are due by 5:00 p.m. Friday, May 31, 2019. Submit completed applications to stem@debeersgroup.com.

Students wishing to participate in the camp must complete the application process including completion of the Participant Information Form and provide a letter from a teacher, Band Councillor, Chief or Métis/Inuit organization leader explaining why the student should be considered for the camp. The following criteria will be considered when selecting the candidates:

- ✓ Indigenous Female from IBA Group
- ✓ Grade 7 and 8 students
- ✓ Demonstrated interest in STEM

To apply:

- Complete the attached Participant Information form, including Caregiver Information and Signature to confirm the parent/caregiver has consented to the application and acknowledge they must also participate in the camp should you be chosen
- The accompanying caregiver must be female
- Applicant must be an Indigenous female and enrolled in Grade 7 or 8 as of the end of the 2018-2019 school year
- Provide a letter signed by a teacher, Band Councillor, Chief, or Métis/Inuit organization leader must accompany the application
- Applicants/caregiver must have identification required for air travel in Canada: https://www.publicsafety.gc.ca/cnt/ntnl-scrt/cntr-trrrsm/pssngr-prtct/dcmnts-en.aspx
- Additional priority will be given to applicants who are a member of one of the following organizations or be able to demonstrate their Indigenous status: Tlicho First Nations, Yellowknives Dene First Nation, Lutsel K'e Dene First Nation, Deninu Kué First Nation, NWT Métis Nation, North Slave Métis Alliance, Attawapiskat First Nation, Moose Cree First Nation, Fort Albany First Nation, Kasheshewan First Nation, an Inuit resident of Igaluit or Pangnirtung

De Beers Canada will cover the following costs:

- Travel for participant and one caregiver from their home community to the University of Waterloo, including one-night hotel stay in Yellowknife, Timmins, Iqaluit/Ottawa (depending upon air schedule) to and from the camp
- Meals during travel (alcohol not included)
- Accommodation and meals while at the IMPACT Camp

Participants are responsible for the following expenses:

- Souvenirs
- Personal items, including toiletries and snacks

Incomplete applications will not be considered, so please ensure you submit all required forms and letters prior to the May 31 application deadline.
