Getting There? Participants will travel from their home community to

Yellowknife, NT then travel to Peterborough, ON as a group.

Chaperones? One or two chaperones will accompany the group to the FNIYES

National Science Camp. The chaperone(s) will travel with the group from Yellowknife, NT to and from Peterborough, Ontario.

Accommodations? Trent University Residence, Peterborough, ON

Costs? All costs for participants, including travel, meals and

accommodation will be covered by ISC.

Student participants are allowed to bring a maximum of

\$250.00 in personal spending money.

Safety? Where applicable, students are to be brought to their local

airport by a parent or guardian.

In the event that scheduling requires a participant to fly unaccompanied, the airline will be made aware that it is a juvenile travelling unaccompanied, so that supervision will be provided in the airport and while boarding and leaving the

aircraft.

Chaperones and/or CIRNAC staff will meet the students upon arrival in Yellowknife, NT. Chaperones will accompany students

to the camp and will be with them at all times.

When returning home, if not travelling with them, the chaperones will remain with the students at the airport.

Who can apply?

Indigenous students aged 12 -15 (at the time of the camp) enrolled in school full time in the Northwest Territories. Applicants must have demonstrated an interest in science.

Application?

To be considered, applicants must complete the application and provide:

- 1. An essay written by the student applicant describing why they want to participate in the National Science camp and what they could contribute to the camp. The essay is to be a maximum of one (1) page typed or two (2) handwritten pages.
- 2. A letter of recommendation provided by a community leader, teacher or principal outlining why the student should represent their region at the national camp.
- 3. A signed statement of eligibility.
- 4. A signed parental permission form.

A selection committee will choose two finalists from each of the following regions: Dehcho, Akaitcho, Tłįcho, Sahtu and Beaufort-Delta. From the ten (10) finalists, the committee will choose five (5) regional representatives and five (5) alternates.

Applications which do not include all the required documentation will not be considered.

Deadline?

The deadline for submissions of complete applications is **Monday**, **May 20**, **2019**. Applications must be received by this date. Late applications will not be considered.

Applications may be submitted by email or fax. A hard copy including all the original signed documents must follow by mail.

Any alternates selected will be notified on or before <u>Friday</u>, <u>June 7, 2019</u> and confirmation of acceptance to be a participant must be received by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>June 12, 2019</u>.
