- be of Indigenous ancestry
- be a resident of N'Dilo, Dettah, Yellowknife, Behchoko, Whati, Gameti or Wekweti
- be enrolled full-time (100 percent course load) for the above referenced potential work opportunities
- be accepted and starting classes in the Fall of 2023
- intend to work in the Northwest Territories after successful completion of the program.

- most recent transcript
- completed application
- current resume
- Proof of Indigenous status
