- (1) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Substance abuse by conducting dedicated community patrols and school talks. Wha Ti members continue to receive information on how alcohol and drugs are being brought into the community. Patrols are made for the purpose of intercepting alcohol and drugs on land, air and water. There have been multiple seizures of liquor and drugs so far this year. Liquor has been intercepted in the community in the month of April.
- (2) There were no reported domestic assaults in April 2014.
- (3) This month the detachment was involved with the youth by speaking with them at the school, youth center, skating rink, toboggan hill, on the playgrounds and around the community when patrolling. The youth of this community frequently attend the Wha Ti detachment for stickers and coloring books, this opportunity is used to educate the youth on the abuse of alcohol and drugs. New books focusing on youth and drugs have been distributed during April with discussions had with the youth on the content. Both members of the Detachment make regular visits to the school each month. Members attend to the Youth Center and interact with the youth here as well. Members took time on their days off to take the youth tobogganing on two separate weekends this month.

Notable events for Month:

This month the community of Wha Ti held their annual Winter Carnival. As such two extra Members were called into assist as it was believed that there would be an increase in population. All in all the weekend was a success and the calls for service were manageable. Multiple members of the community were intoxicated at the local dance and were given rides home and asked not to return intoxicated.
