Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities

Community approved APP'S are

- (1) Substance Abuse
- (2) Domestic Violence
- (3) Youth - Substance Abuse

- (1) This month the detachment addressed the issue of Substance abuse by conducting dedicated community patrols and school talks. Wha Ti members continue to receive information on how alcohol and drugs are being brought into the community. Patrols are made for the purpose of intercepting alcohol and drugs on land, air and water. There have been multiple seizures of liquor and drugs so far this year. No liquor was seized during the month of May.
- (2) There was one reported domestic assault in May 2014. An adult male has been charged with the assault and is set to appear in Wha Ti Territoiral Court on 2014-07-22.
- (3) This month the detachment was involved with the youth by speaking with them at the school, youth center, on the playgrounds and around the community when patrolling. The youth of this community frequently attend the Wha Ti detachment for stickers and coloring books, this opportunity is used to educate the youth on the abuse of alcohol and drugs. New books focusing on youth and drugs have been distributed during May with discussions had with the youth on the content. Both members of the Detachment make regular visits to the school each month. Members attend to the Youth Center and interact with the youth here as well. Members took time to play baseball with the youth at the local ball diamond and basketball at the school.

Notable Occurrences for the Month:

The Wha Ti RCMP had a report of a stolen vehicle belonging to the hamlet. There was significant damage to both the truck and trailer that was being towed. The investigation is currently ongoing with no known witnesses or suspects at this time. The Wha Ti RCMP encourages members of the community to come forward with any information they have to assist in the solving of this crime.

A break and enter was reported on May 29th at house 123 in Wha Ti. Three youth and one adult male have been charged. All charged persons have been placed on strict conditions including a curfew of 11PM to 7AM daily.

New Community Concerns (update on concerns raised in the past not yet resolved)

This month a new concern regarding young males in the community forming a gang. A photo was taken on top of the school where 6 youth were identified wearing all red clothing, bandana's over a couple faces, and showing gang type hand signs. This issue is being addressed by the entire community including the Wha Ti RCMP Detachment.

Community Policing Activities or Events (if not identified in the APP's)

- Members attended the Youth Center on three separate occasions
- Members played baseball with the youth at the local ball diamond
- Cst. SHEWFELT gave detachment tours to some of the local youth
- Cpl. MACLELLAN along with Cst. SHEWFELT's spouse played basketball with local youth at the Mezi School
